The Bahamas Primary School Student of the Year Foundation is pleased to announce that its annual nationwide search is currently being conducted for the best primary school students. This prestigious competition that was established in 1997 will recognize young, talented grade 6 students from throughout The Bahamas for their high scholastic and extra-curricular achievements in the 2022 Bahamas Primary School Student of the Year Awards Program.

#### **Important Information**

Application forms will be considered incomplete and subject to rejection, if any sections of the application requirements are missing.

An independent Distinguished Panel of Judges will review application packages received and determine the overall winner and finalists. **THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES IS FINAL.** 

Nominees will be judged on the following criteria: contribution to school life, academic achievement, extra-curricular achievement, community involvement and overall presentation of the portfolio submitted. (Academic achievement alone does not guarantee placement in the Awards program.)

Nominees will be competing for scholarships and prizes. All scholarships must be used for Bahamian secondary education purposes only.

The contest is opened to any 6th Grade Student regardless of colour, creed, nationality or religious affiliation from any accredited private, public or independent primary school in The Bahamas.

#### SCHOOLS CAN NOMINATE ONLY ONE (1) STUDENT.

The deadline for submission of completed application packages for the 2021 Bahamas Primary School Student of the Year will be Friday, February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022 at 4:00pm EST. The Foundation will not be responsible for application packages which are late, lost, illegible, damaged, or incorrectly addressed. All packages submitted will become the property of The Bahamas Primary School Student of the Year Foundation and WILL NOT BE RETURNED.

#### The Application Requirements

- (a) A completed application form
- (b) A 500 word essay on the topic: "The pandemic has drastically changed our lives. As students, the last year you personally had a full traditional school year was in the 3rd grade. Given your experiences both in "traditional" and "alternate" learning environments, how would you have envisioned your 'dream' classroom? What overall changes would you have made to ensure that the transition from traditional to alternative learning was seamless, productive, and beneficial for students?"

#### The essay must be legibly handwritten in black or blue ink.

Essays must be the student's original work and must not infringe upon any material protected by copyright laws.

- (c) An essay which was submitted and graded as a part of the applicant's school requirement **must be** attached to the application package. (5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> grade only)
- (d) Copies of official report cards (covering 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> grades only)
- (e) **Two (2)** high quality headshot colour **4 x 6 photographs** (These photos are for the newspapers, website and souvenir awards booklet.) Photos will not be returned. (Student attire: school uniform) Photos must be labelled with the nominee's name and school on the back of them.
- (f) Newspaper clippings / copies of awards & certificates (covering 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> grades only)
- (g) Three (3) letters of recommendation:
  - School Principal / Vice-Principal (The letter from the Principal / Vice-Principal officially nominates the student for this award. Please note that any application missing this letter will automatically be disqualified.;
  - (2) Classroom teacher / civic or community leader / former teacher;
  - (3) Religious leader / extra-curricular coach (ie. Sports or Dance).
- (h) Nominee must have documented proof of length of participation in each organization listed on the application form;
- (j) The portfolio / folder is limited to a maximum of 50 leaflet pages (using both sides will be considered 1 page) and should not be larger than 12 x 12. The nominee is requested to adhere to these requirements. (Points will be deducted for portfolio / folder not following the guidelines outlined.)
- (k) **200 250 word statement** on "Why I should be selected as the 2021 Bahamas Primary School Student of the Year?
- (1) **Assessment of \$50.00** (One (1) Student of the Year T-Shirt and one (1) DVD Set of the Medal Presentation & Awards Ceremony)

Application packages will be rated on appearance, verifiability of information, clarity, and evidence of achievements. Application packages missing any required items or arriving after the February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022 deadline would be disqualified.
